9:15 - Classes

1. Spirituality 101: Staying Close to God in Urban Ministry -- Anthony Wood, Steven Morris

 Maintaining one's spirituality is crucial not only to the urban minister's personal health but also foundational to his/her ministry efforts. Come ready to hear and discuss getting with and staying with God in ways that will help you meet the demands of urban ministry.

Social Work Perspective on Urban Ministry -- Marci Rhodes, Sarah Meigs (CEU*)

1. City Connections: Networking Across Your City -- Jeff Spry (CEU*)

- Living in an urban center requires that we, Christ-followers, give special attention to
 individuals who are susceptible and vulnerable to Satan's attacks to kill and destroy. This
 vulnerability is intensified for many because they have little or no support system to
 surround them with encouragement, guidance, and support. Fortunately in most of our
 urban centers across the country, non-profit organizations have emerged and are led by
 Christians that have devoted their lives to addressing some specific social issue which
 endangers the quality of life for many of the least of these in our cities.
- It is our bias that only when we build collaborative partnerships with representation from all of the various sectors will we begin to see significant advances in our addressing some of the societal issues that plague our cities. We believe it is the responsibility of Christfollowers to be discerning, intentional and strategic in helping to build and unify these relational connections. Are you one of those servant leaders?

2. A Church that Stayed: Middle Class Churches Staying in the City -- Paul Wilkerson, Danny Dodd.

 A discussion of the history of the Levy church, and it's decision to stay in a community that became the inner city, the challenges of being that church today, and plans for serving this community in the future.

3. Setting Captives Free: A Biblical and Practical Framework to Finding Freedom and Fullness in Christ - Keith Lape

 Introducing an approach to helping people, by faith, access the full resources of the Gospel to experience the abundant life Jesus came provide for all—enabling them to gain liberation from the hurts, habits, and hang-ups that have been holding them down.

3. Crossing Thresholds to Purposeful Life: HopeWorks & Hand Up Housing - Don & Deanne Williams, Jonda Pieper (CEU*)

An overview of two Christ-centered outreach programs that empower homeless or low-income individuals to move from hopelessness to self-sufficiency. HopeWorks is an educational program and Hand Up Housing is an individualized short-term housing program. Learn how they work as a gateway to influence holistic growth toward healthy functioning.
